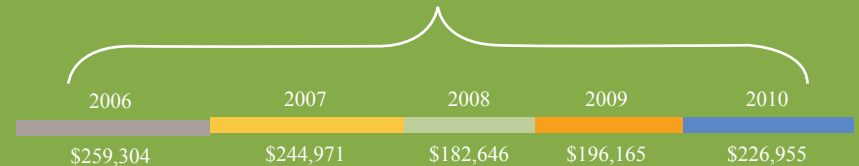

## Foundation Project Update – Improving Emergency Care

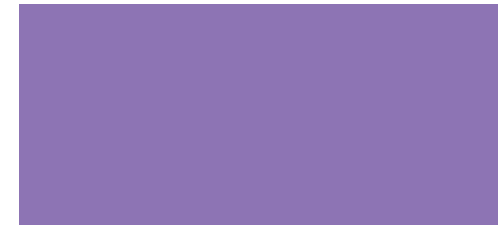
The Kittitas County community demonstrated its commitment to supporting emergency care at the eighth annual Magical Evening gala, held on April 9, 2011. The response was overwhelming—a total of \$61,700 was pledged to support a new patient entrance and renovation of the KVCH Emergency Department.

KVCH is currently finalizing the design for the Emergency Department new patient entrance and renovation. Construction is expected to begin this winter. The renovation will provide a secure and private entrance for patients and will allow KVCH to meet the growing demand for emergency services.

With the generous support of donors, the renovation will allow for accommodation of more patients and will decrease the average wait time. Future emergency patients who do not arrive by ambulance will be escorted directly to a treatment room and can then be seen by a provider as quickly as possible.

KVCH has a strong dedication to improving emergency care, collaborating with local Emergency Medical Services and regional specialty centers. This teamwork has led to national recognition of KVCH as a leader in emergency response.

KVCH also has established award-winning partnerships with surrounding facilities, including a STEMI heart attack program with Yakima Regional Medical and Cardiac Center and a telestroke collaboration with Virginia Mason Medical Center in Seattle. These programs and initiatives help provide Kittitas County residents with the very best possible care in the state.
